In an attempt to better understand the prevalence and circumstances of domestic violence fatalities in Ohio, the Ohio Domestic Violence Network reviewed media reports identified by staff members or local member programs. Fatalities included targeted victims, perpetrators, and others at incidents.

1 FATALITY



43 cases involved a single fatality.

MULTIPLE FATALITIES



26 cases involved multiple fatalities.

SAME SEX RELATIONSHIP



2 cases involved same sex relationships.

SUSPECTED ATTACKER FATALITIES



11 suspected attackers were killed by a 3rd party.



Incidents occurred in homes, workplaces, public intersections, roadways, parking lots.
