


2022 Impact Report

The **ODVN Relocation & Safety Assistance** program run by the Ohio Domestic Violence Network provides domestic violence survivors with security deposits, rent, transportation, moving expenses, or utilities so they can move to safe housing. The goal is to move families to safety quickly.

2022 Numbers Served and Expense	 • 482 DV survivors and 548 children served with Relocation Assistance • \$379,843.58 in direct support for security deposits, rent, utilities, moving, and safety expenses. • Requests ranged from \$22.50 to \$1,200; average \$611.25 	
Who Needed Help	 Females (97%) and survivors with children (32.4%) Half were people of color: 38.6% African American/Black, 4.2% Hispanic, and 1.7% Asian 30.1% identified as homeless; most experience housing insecurity More than 90% at or below 200% of the federal poverty level 	
Factors	 Lives of survivor and children have been threatened Few or no financial resources; no safety net Abuser has controlled or ruined their financial life No support network since many have been isolated by their abuser 	
Measurements & Accountability	ODVN tracks and reports to Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) the number served , number of children , demographics , payments on behalf of survivors , and receipts .	
Hotel Assistance Program	Due to COVID-19 creating limited capacity at shelters , ODVN provided Hotel Assistance with emergency stays at hotels near domestic violence shelters. Since April 2020, ODVN has served 794 survivors and 798 children with \$548,712.45 in hotel assistance.	
Safety Creates Security	G G After I got the relocation assistance for utilities and rent and got moved in, I was finally allowed to sleep through the night for the first time in years. I finally felt safe enough to sleep.	G I had no idea help like this existed. I truly believed I was going to die at the hands of my abuser. And while this might not be much to some, the relocation assistance saved my life, and that of my children.
