New State Budget Includes \$20 Million in Operational Support for Ohio's DV **Programs**

Thanks to an extraordinary grassroots effort, the 2024-25 state budget includes \$20 million in operational support for Ohio's domestic violence programs, a significant increase over the last budget.

ODVN is especially grateful to Gov. Mike DeWine and Attorney General Dave Yost, who included that amount in their budgets, and the many legislative champions who ensured the funding was not cut while the proposed budget made its way through the approval process.

ODVN and OAESV Staffers Advocate on Capitol Hill for Increased Funding for Services

In partnership with the Ohio Alliance to End Sexual Violence, ODVN representatives advocated for increased funding for domestic violence and sexual assault survivors on Capitol Hill. During meetings with House and Senate staffers in June, they stressed the importance of ensuring the federal budget includes sufficient funding to meet survivors' housing, legal, economic, safety, and other urgent needs.


