Health Access Project Takes Off With Launch of CARE Connection

ODVN's Health Access project kicked into high gear in January with the launch of CARE Connection, a behavioral health referral service for survivors.

All member DV programs across the state may refer survivors who need behavioral health services to the CARE Connection. Survivors are eligible for five to 10 virtual counseling sessions provided by therapists who have received training about domestic violence, brain injury, and working with vulnerable and marginalized populations. Direct service program staff are also eligible for services.
