Kids Come First S.B. 174: Protecting the Best Interests of Children

Across Ohio, survivors of domestic violence are navigating custody systems ill-suited to address the complexities of abuse. The law asks survivors to co-parent with the person who has harmed them and/or their child and measures how well they co-parent with their abuser. As noted family law attorney and author <u>Meg Groff</u> states:

"Victims of domestic violence are the only victims who, if they have children, are forced to communicate with their assailants—weekly, daily—and judged by how nice they are about it."

That is why ODVN and our member programs and numerous allied professional organizations **support Senate Bill 174**, which was designed to prioritize child well-being and protect families.

What the Bill Does

- Does not create a presumption of equal parenting time.
- Modernizes outdated legal language and reduces terminology that exacerbates conflict.
- Expands the "best interest of the child" factors from 13 to 24, adding new criteria that require courts to weigh any past or present history of domestic violence, coercive litigation tactics, or the safety of both the child and protective parent.
- Strengthens child safety, allowing courts to approve or order a restriction in parenting responsibilities if the court finds that the restriction is reasonably calculated to protect a child from physical, sexual, or emotional abuse or a parent from domestic violence.
- Clarifies available remedies including supervised visits, no contact, or other restrictions when parenting time would put a child or survivor at risk.
- Elevates children's voices, allowing in-camera interviews with the judge, and prohibits submission of affidavits or pressure-based statements from minors.
- Allows courts to appoint both a guardian ad litem and a separate attorney for the child, clarifying roles to support both best interest and expressed wishes.
- Prohibits courts from favoring one parent due to income, gender, or housing status.
- **Provides remedies that help families**, including parent education and counseling to help parents meet their responsibilities.
- Requires appeals be given calendar priority.

More work needs to be done to improve the way Ohio's courts handle custody matters when a parent is a survivor of abuse. We support S.B. 174 because it enhances transparency and trust in our family court system: parents and survivors will have clearer expectations about what the courts must consider, and judges will have better tools and guidance to make decisions rooted in safety, accountability, and the child's actual needs.

S.B. 174 is a bill we can build on because it centers what matters most: safety, for children and parents. Under S.B.174, *Kids Come First*.
