



Supportive Programming for Survivors

Relocation and Safety Assistance

Provides financial assistance to survivors of IPV, SV & stalking to assist with relocation. Includes, but not limited to first month's rent and deposit, moving expenses, utility payments, storage costs, lock changes and security cameras. Up to \$1200 in assistance may be provided.

Provides short-term hotel stays for survivors when shelter is not an option due to capacity issues, illness, or other safety-related concerns. Stays are temporary while a long-term housing plan is being developed. Referring programs must continue to provide advocacy and supportive services to the survivor. This program is funded through Franklin County-specific resources and is not available statewide.

Housing Program

Provides eligible survivors in Balance of State counties with Rapid Rehousing assistance to assist with finding permanent, affordable & safe housing, using the Housing-First model. Survivors using the program receive rental assistance & supportive services.

Provides up to 3 months of rental assistance for survivors of domestic violence in Balance of State counties who qualify & are facing eviction or homelessness or fleeing DV. Referrals should come from member programs. Can help with past due rent & future rent to prevent homelessness and first month's rent & deposit for those fleeing DV.

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Legal Assistance Program

Provides civil legal services to survivors of Domestic Violence, Sexual Violence, Stalking & Human trafficking who cannot be assisted through traditional legal aid programs. ODVN assists eligible survivors whose income is at or below 225% of the federal poverty level.

Connects survivors with physical & behavioral health practitioners, with the help of mobile advocates at local programs. Provides financial assistance for health-related issues of survivors of DV, IPV, SV, Stalking & Human Trafficking. Assistance can also be provided to programs around serving survivors with brain injury, substance use disorders or mental illness.
