 - This dashboard of State Rankings: Indicators Associated with Intimate Partner / Domestic Violence represents community and societal level indicators that the ODVN Prevention Team has researched and will monitor through at least 2023. The Prevention Team believes that the national rankings paint a strong picture of Ohio's public health status. Considered collectively, these indicators suggest that when US rankings are lower, Ohio's community public health status will be improved. Thus, community problems such as

sexual and domestic violence (and other forms of violence) are likely to be reduced when we all work together to improve these indicators.
