The **Ohio Domestic Violence Network** advances the principle that all people have the right to an oppression and violence-free life; fosters changes in our economic, social and political systems and brings leadership, expertise and best practices to community programs.

About ODNV

ODNV is a non-profit, membership organization in Columbus, Ohio, with a network of **76 local domestic violence programs** that serve all 88 Ohio counties. ODNV advocates for **survivors** and their **children**. ODNV provided these services in **2025**.



Member Services Provided

Nearly **75,000 survivors** served

9,486 survivors were sheltered, including **4,377 children**. However, **9,677 survivors**—more than 50%—were **turned away** because the shelter was full or lacked staffing capacity.



Our member programs and ODNV answered **121,548** direct crisis communications (calls, texts, and chats), an average of **333 a day**, nearly **14 per hour**.

581,340 services were provided to survivors. They included **legal advocacy, behavioral health, meals, shelter, transitional housing, and other services**.

47,404 adults and **75,832 youth** received prevention programming



Our programs served an estimated number of **502,728 meals** * January - December 2025

Housing

Our relocation program helped **912 survivors** and **1,026 children** move into safe homes with their families spending nearly **\$769,000** in funds.



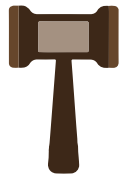
Our hotel program assisted **586 survivors** and **691 children** with **\$459,063** in funds and referrals from **42 different agencies**.



Our housing program moved **551 survivors** into permanent housing and provided supportive services for **946 individuals**. * Federal FY 2025

Legal

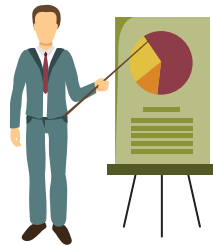
Our legal assistance program helped **over 133 survivors** with a wide range of legal services to help them build safer lives.



Legal advocates at ODNV's member programs assisted **25,067** survivors in municipal, juvenile, and common pleas courts. * Federal FY 2025

Training

Our Training Academy provides the only comprehensive training in Ohio for front-line advocates who provide services to domestic violence survivors. A total of **18,621 people** attended **309 trainings**.

One Day Snap Shot

Ohio's DV programs provided these services during the National Census of Domestic Violence Services conducted by the National Network to End Domestic Violence on **September 10, 2025**:



- Sheltered **1,951 adults and children** and provided non-residential support services to **1,029 adults and children**.
- Turned away **159** requests for help because programs lacked the funding or staff

Prevention

Our prevention programs work to transform individuals and communities to bring an end to DV. The Ohio Men's Action Network (OHMAN) has provided **training to 1,685 individuals**.

ODNV member programs served **1,610 survivors of Human Trafficking**.



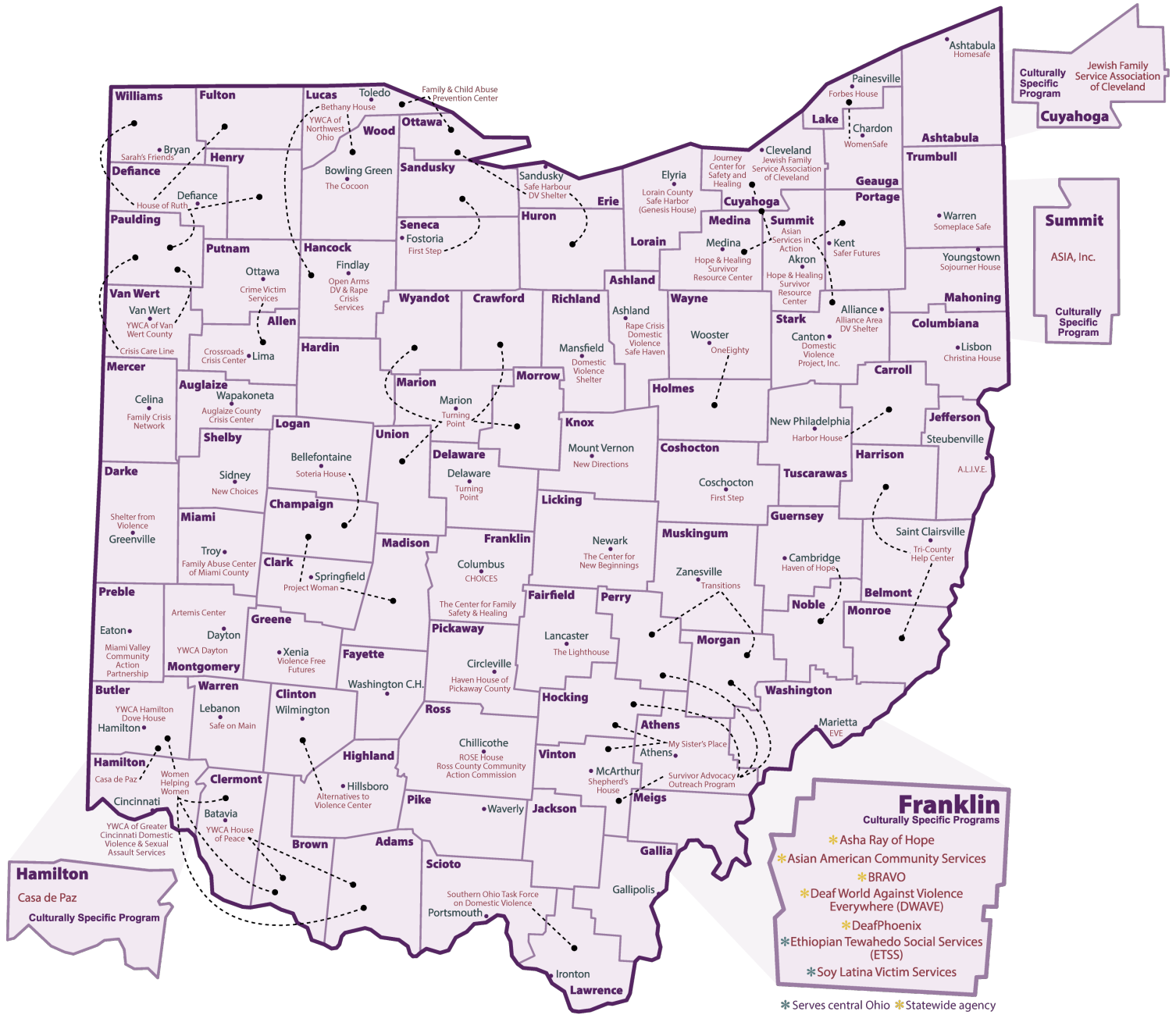
